### Ethnic Distribution



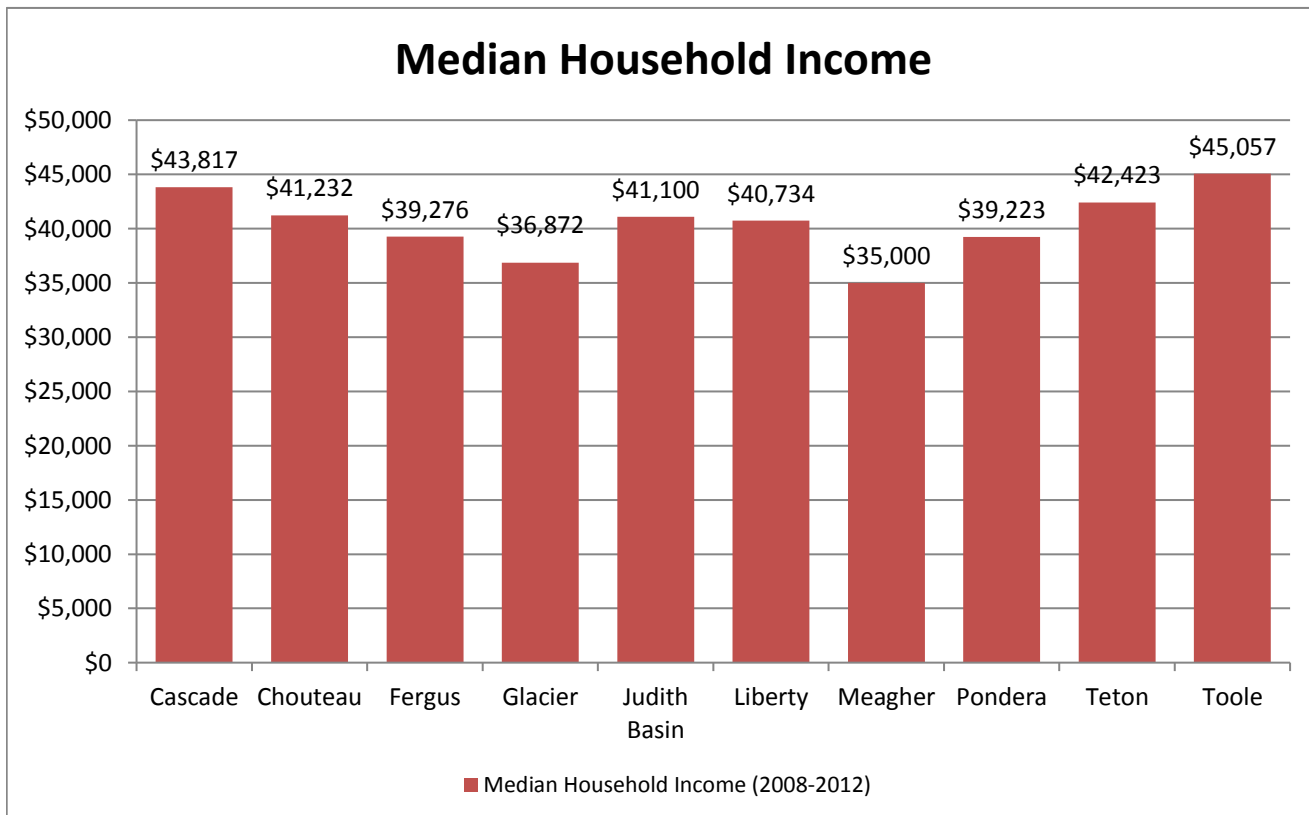
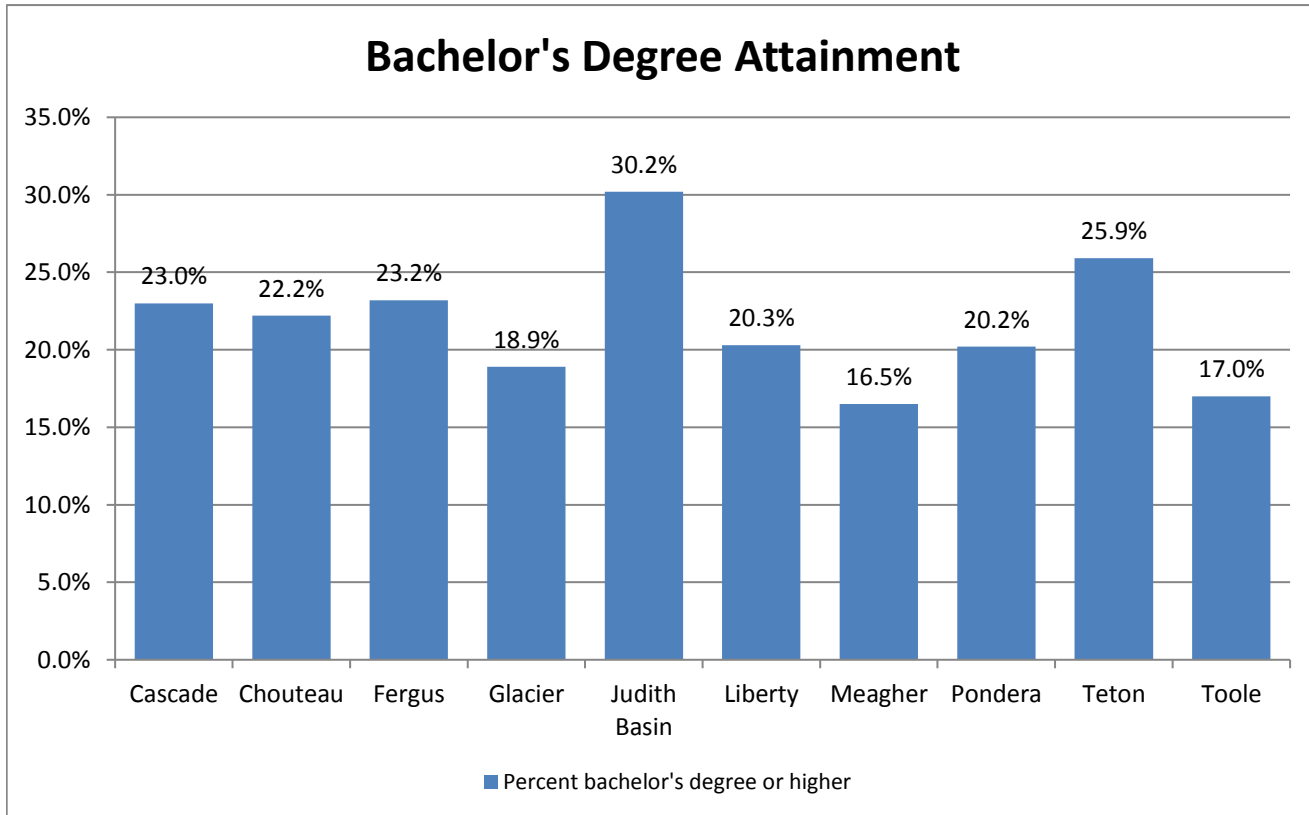
