<b>1. Montanans with Some College and No Degree</b>	<b>Presenter:</b> <i>Eleazar Ortega</i>	<b>ET Lead:</b>
<p>Ms. Ortega presented information regarding Montanans with some college and no degree. (See attached.) She noted that OCHE does not track this information, but she was able to gather data from the US Census Bureau, EMSI, and the National Student Clearinghouse. This report is only telling us how many people are out there who have some college and no degree, it does not tell us who they are. Ms. Ortega will continue to dig into the data for further refinement.</p>

<p>Ms. Alexander discussed how to best gather campus information and marketing needs:</p> <p><u>Information Sharing</u>  It was recommended Taylor attend the Division meetings in the fall to share the information she would like to receive from the faculty. Dr. Wolff will send out a note to campus in August announcing her new position.</p> <p><u>Marketing Requests &amp; Design</u>  She will create an online form to better organize and prioritize marketing requests. She will also update the policy and procedure regarding design and branding standards to be used by all who create and distribute flyers, invitations, posters, etc. All internal and external materials need to be reviewed by the Communications and Marketing Department.</p> <p><u>Student Voice</u>  Taylor will work with faculty to get student stories and will discuss at Division meetings this fall.</p> <p><u>50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary</u>  A campaign and marketing plan for the college's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary communications was shared.</p>

  - Data disaggregated by age, geographical location

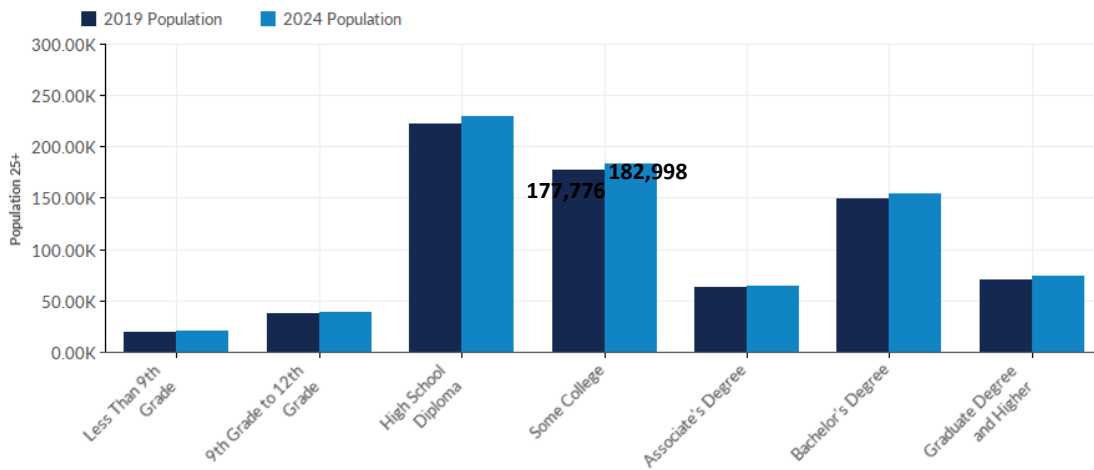
# Montana

- Total Montana population
  - 2017: 16.5% estimated with some college, no degree<sup>1</sup>
- Montana population-- age 25 or older
  - 2017: 24.2% estimated with some college, no degree<sup>1</sup>
    - N=170,126
  - 2019: 24.0% estimated with some college, no degree<sup>2</sup>
    - N=177,776
  - 2024: 23.9% estimated with some college, no degree<sup>2</sup>
    - N=182,998

## Montana Population (Age 25+) with Some College, No Degree



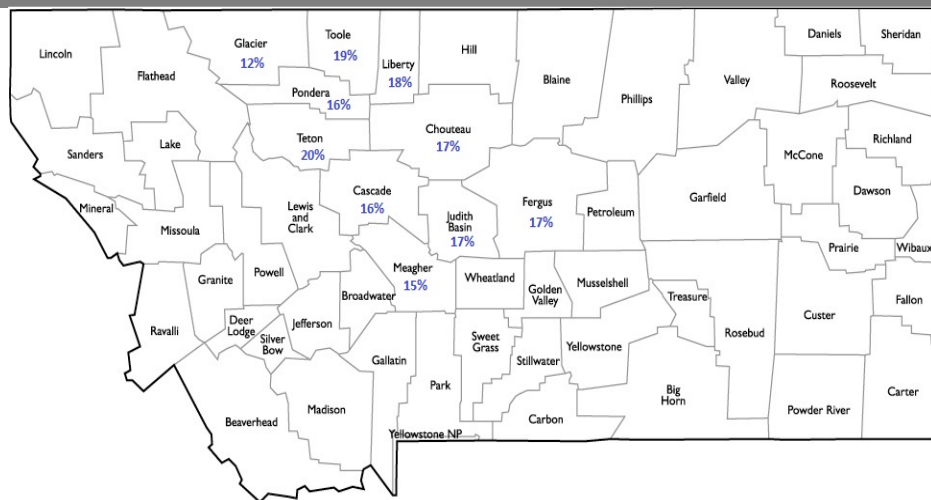

## 2017 National Student Clearinghouse Report

- In a report published by the National Student Clearinghouse in 2017, Montana had 12,694 potential completers.
  - Potential completers: Students with 2 or more years' worth of progress between 8/14/2006 and 8/12/2016.

## 2017 National Student Clearinghouse Report
