1. Healthy Campus Task Force Presenter: Dr. Frost ET Lead: Dr. Frost

Dr. Frost requested feedback for the MUS Task Force Guidelines sent via email. The Great Falls College Healthy Campus Plan will be posted and available for spring 2021 semester. It was noted the MUS directive for requiring masks on campus will continue to be followed. Wearing masks and following protocol this fall is what allowed in-person instruction to continue.

2. Daily COVID Calls Presenter: Ms. Bonilla ET Lead: Ms. Bonilla

The daily calls have focused on vaccinations.

3. CARES Act Student Emergency Funding Presenter: Ms. Bonilla ET Lead: Ms. Bonilla

\$431,373 was distributed to 670 eligible students. More funding is scheduled to be received, and more information will be available soon.

4. CARES Act Institutional Funding Distribution | Presenter: Ms. Roberts | ET Lead: Ms. Roberts

Regarding the funding received from the Governor's Office, \$105,000 was spent on the new building access system, which had a local economic impact; \$69,000 was spent on technology, and \$32,000 went to testing and mitigation. The remainder will be returned.

The Federal CARES Act funds need to be spent by April.
